Recipes from the Caladenia Kitchen

Katie's Zucchini Slice

5 eggs

1 cup S.R. Flour, sifted

375g zucchini – grated

1 large onion, finely chopped

200g rindless bacon, chopped

1 cup cheddar cheese, grated

¼ cup vegetable oil

Method

Pre-heat oven to 170 degrees Celsius. Grease and line a lamington tray.

Beat the eggs in a large bowl until combined. Add the flour and mix until smooth, then add zucchini, onion, bacon, cheese and oil.

Pour into prepared tin and bake in oven for 30 minutes or until cooked through.
