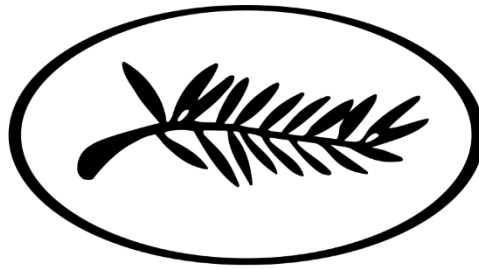

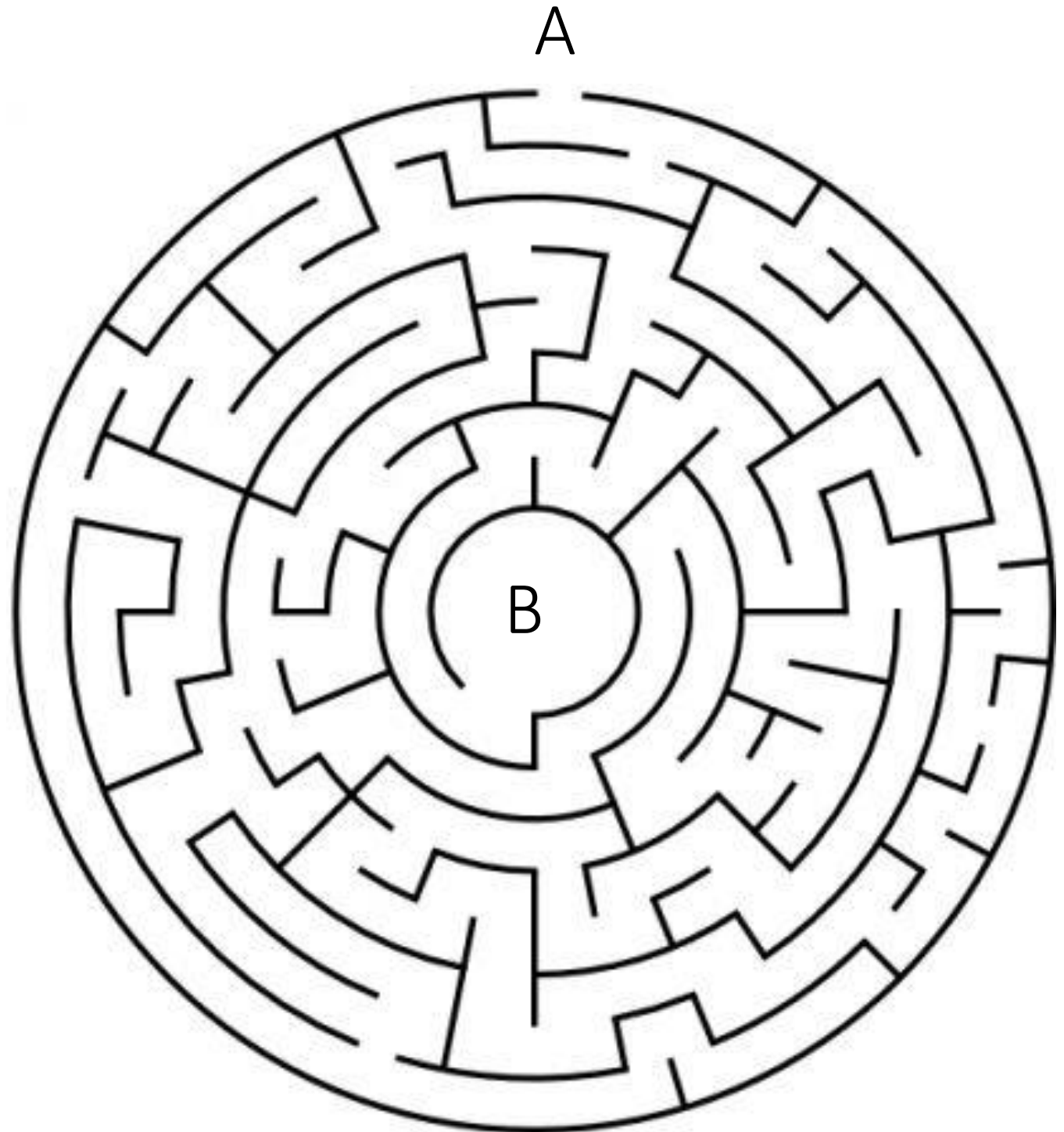

1. Released in 1942, this movie was set in North Africa during WWII. The story is about an American bar owner who is torn between helping the woman he loves and her husband, a resistance leader with the Germans on his tail, escape safely or sending him off alone, and keeping his love with him.

He is given the dangerous task of blowing up a strategic bridge. He falls in love with a Spanish girl, portrayed by Ingrid Bergman. The young American successfully accomplishes his mission but the movie has a tragic end.

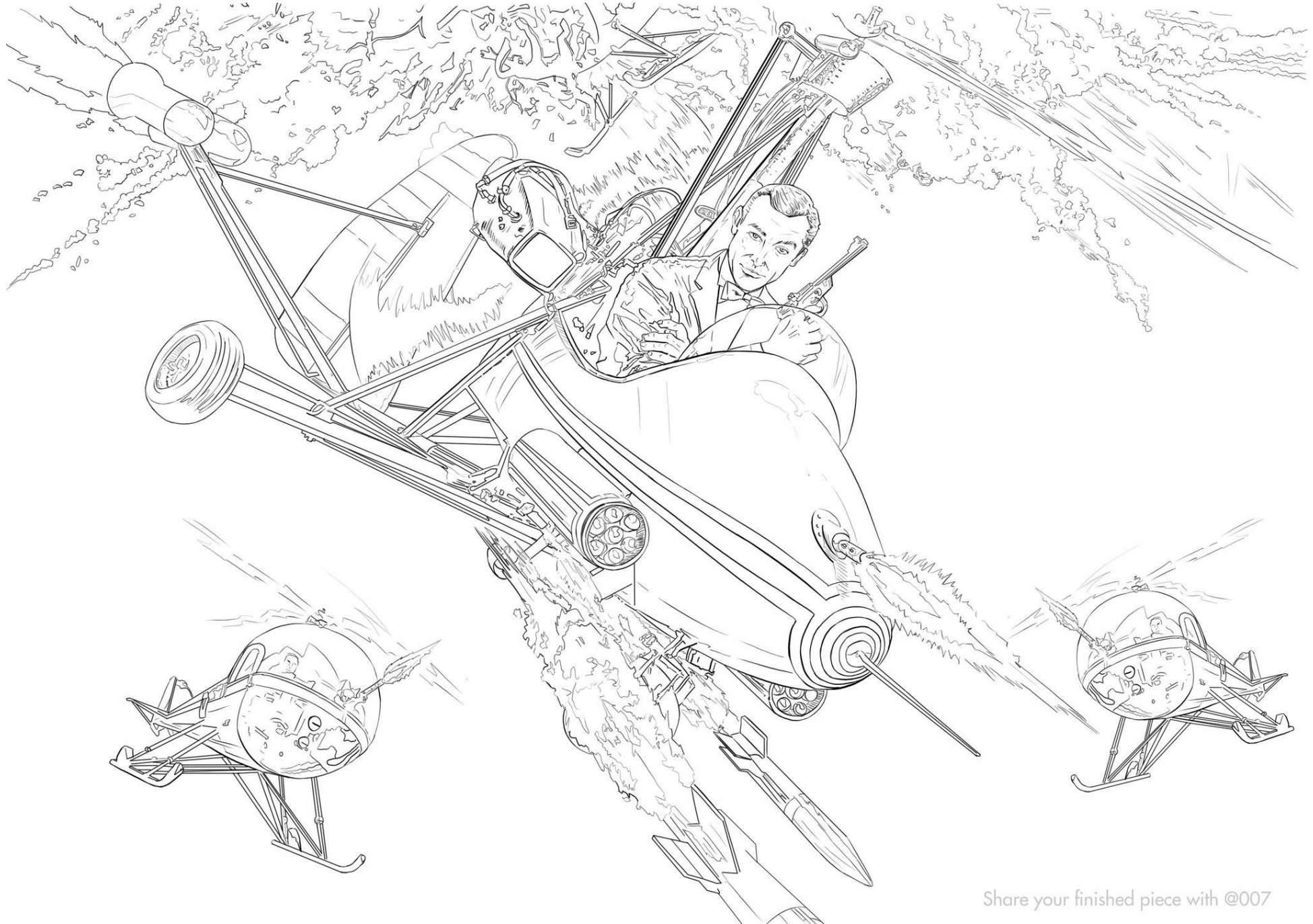

This is a sincere and disarming Christmas story.

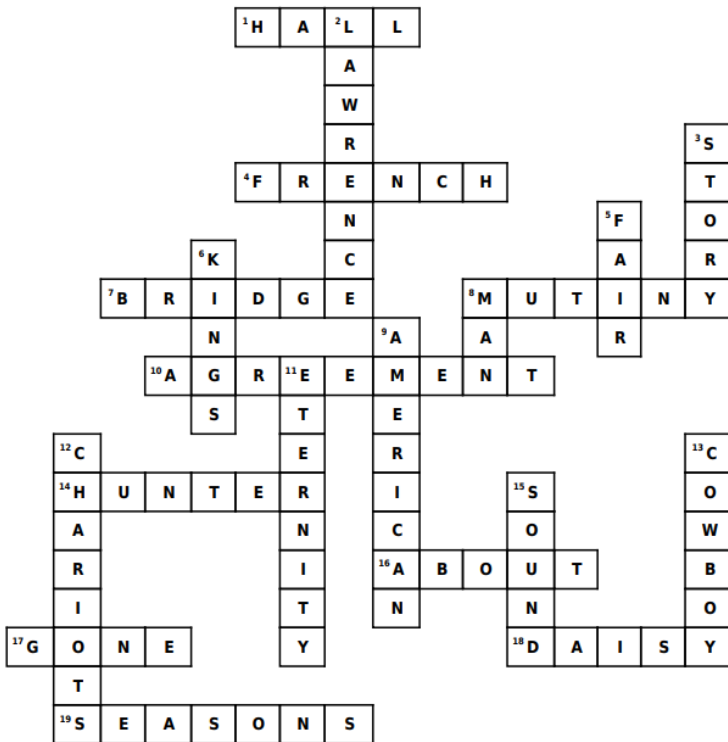


I love how in horror movies the person calls out, "Hello," as if the psycho will answer, "Hey, what's up, I'm in the kitchen. Want a sandwich?"

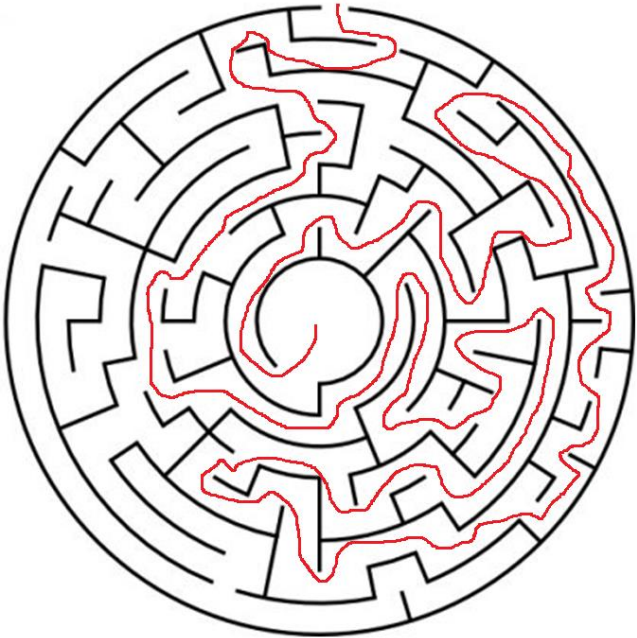
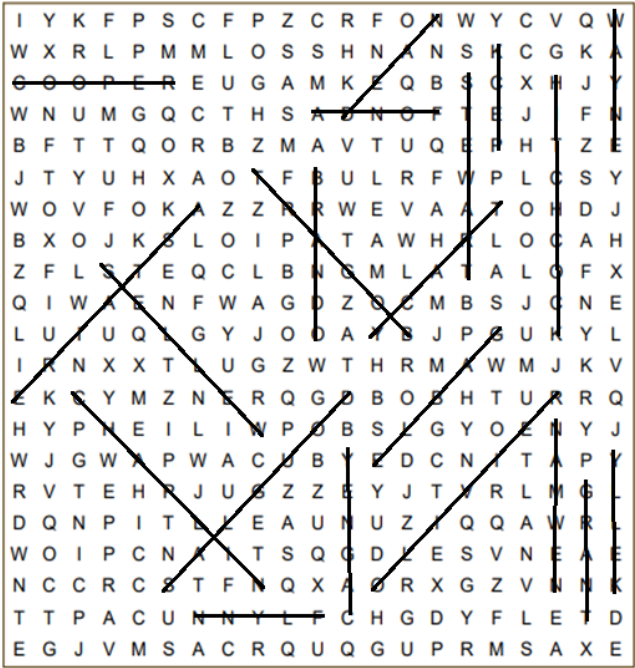

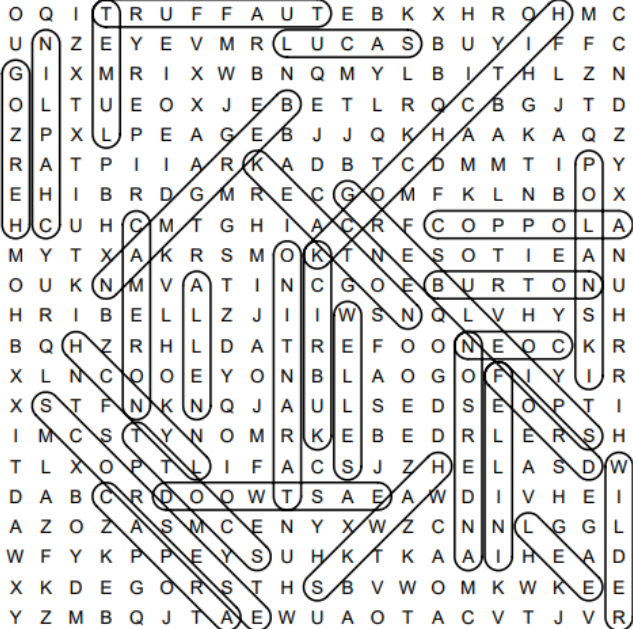
