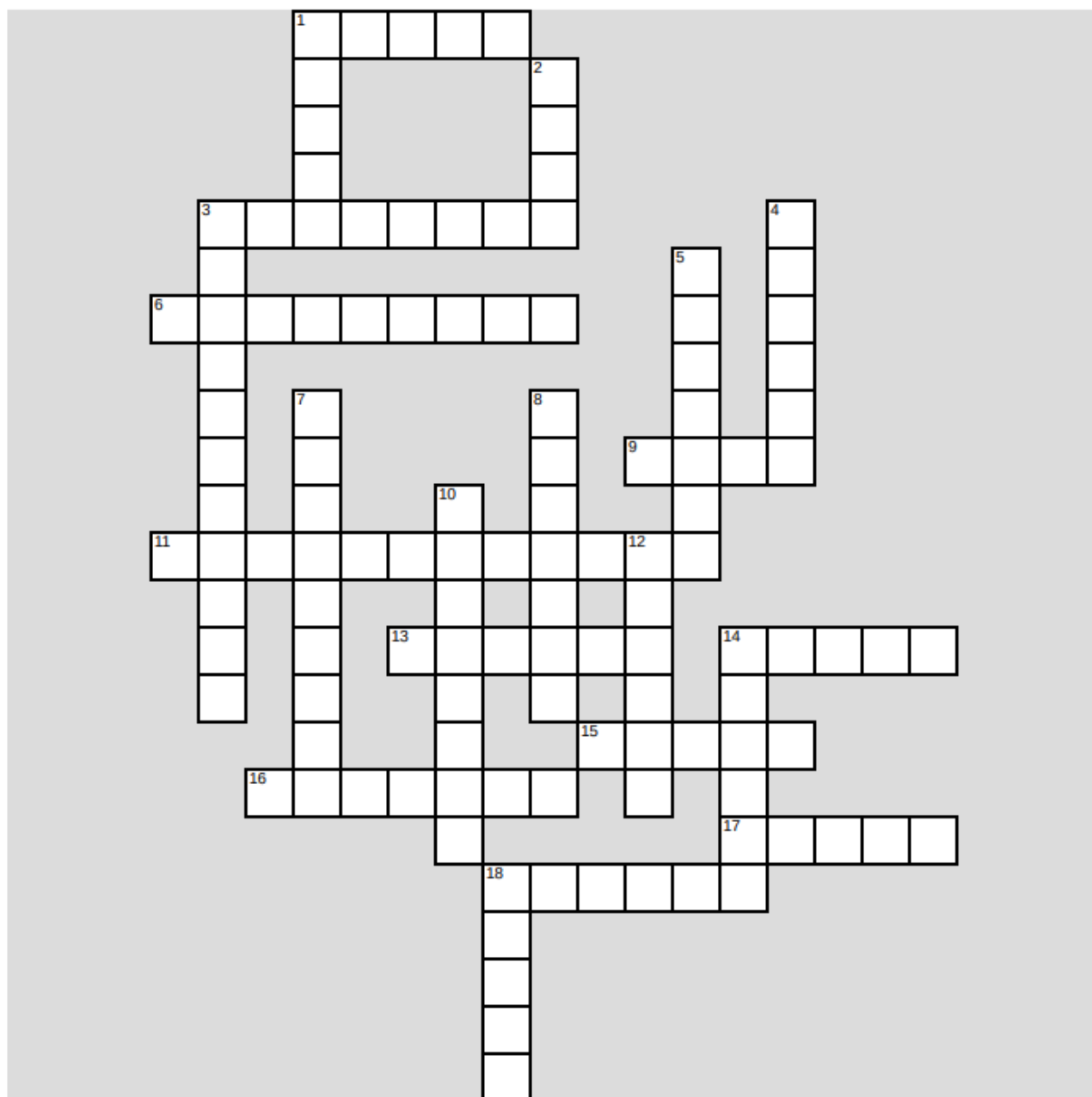

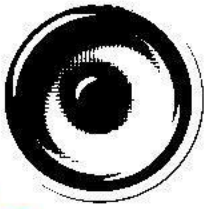

Harper Valley PTA

The Harper Valley PTA song was written by Tom T. Hall and sung by Jeannie C. Riley. Released in 1968, it quickly rose to number one in the pop charts, and it is still the most well-known single of Jeannie Riley's career. Harper Valley PTA was based on a true story. As a young child, Tom heard of a woman who stood up for herself when some parents from the High School her daughter attended started judging her by the way she dressed, and the way she conducted her life in general. Tom says: "I was fascinated by her grit. To see this very insignificant, socially disenfranchised lady - a single mother - to take on the elite of town."

Cat's in the Cradle

Cat's in the Cradle was released in 1974 by folk-rock singer Harry Chapin. It was Chapin's only number 1 hit, and it was nominated for the 1975 Grammy Award. Chapin based the song on a poem his wife Sandra wrote regarding the awkward relationship between her first husband and his father. The song's lyrics tell of a father who is too busy with work and life to spend time with his little boy. As the years go by, the boy grows up and now he is too busy to spend time with his aging father. His father realises that their roles have been switched.

American Pie

Don McLean's song became an anthem for an entire generation. American pie released in 1971, this eight-minute song has cryptic references to the 50s innocence, the turbulent 60s, and the 70s disillusion. The song is mainly about the death of Buddy Holly. McLean was a 13-year-old paperboy when Buddy Holly, Ritchie Vallens and the Big Bopper were killed in an airplane crash. The news devastated him. The song also mentions the jester which is supposed to be Bob Dylan. It refers to him wearing "A coat borrowed from James Dean" Bob in fact had a red jacket like James Dean's on the cover of his album The Freewheeling Bob Dylan. The lyrics: "I met a girl who sang the blues..." references Janis Joplin. The lyrics were also influenced by The Beatles' "Sergeant Peppers" and The Byrds' "Eight Miles High".

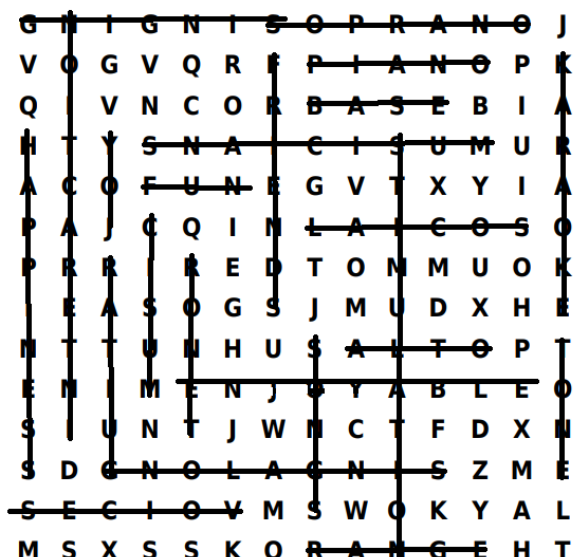

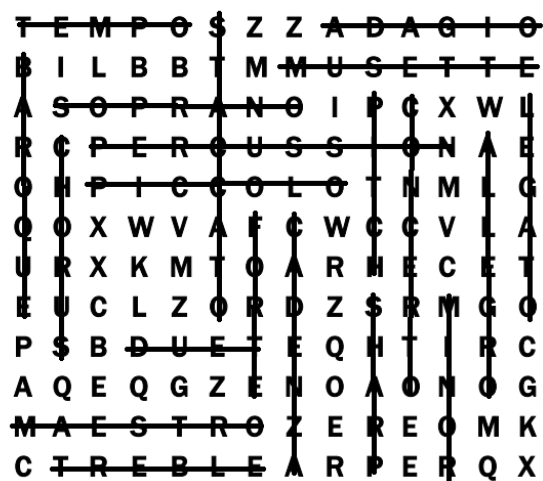

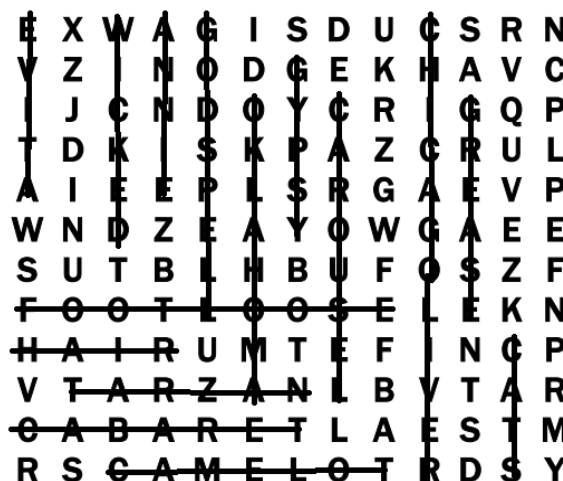
