After the war, I devoted myself to the health and welfare of former prisoners of war and their families.

Recipe of the week from the Caladenia Cookbook

Peter's Steak and Capsicum HotPot

500 gm diced blade steak (or any casserole type)

- 1 425gm tin diced tomatoes
- 2 sticks celery
- 2 cloves garlic
- 1 tblsps Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tblsp Dijon mustard
- 250gm seasoned plain flour
- 1 red capsicum, sliced, seeds removed
- 1 cup red wine

Method

- Chop celery and garlic, fry in oil
- Coat meat in the flour and brown in small batches
- Put meat, celery, garlic, tomatoes, Worcestershire sauce, mustard and wine in a casserole dish.
- Place in pre-heated oven at 180 degrees for 1 ½ hrs
- Add capsicum for the last 20mins
- Serve with mashed spuds, beans or peas.
- Drink the rest of the wine and it'll taste even better!!!
