FOOD IN INDIA

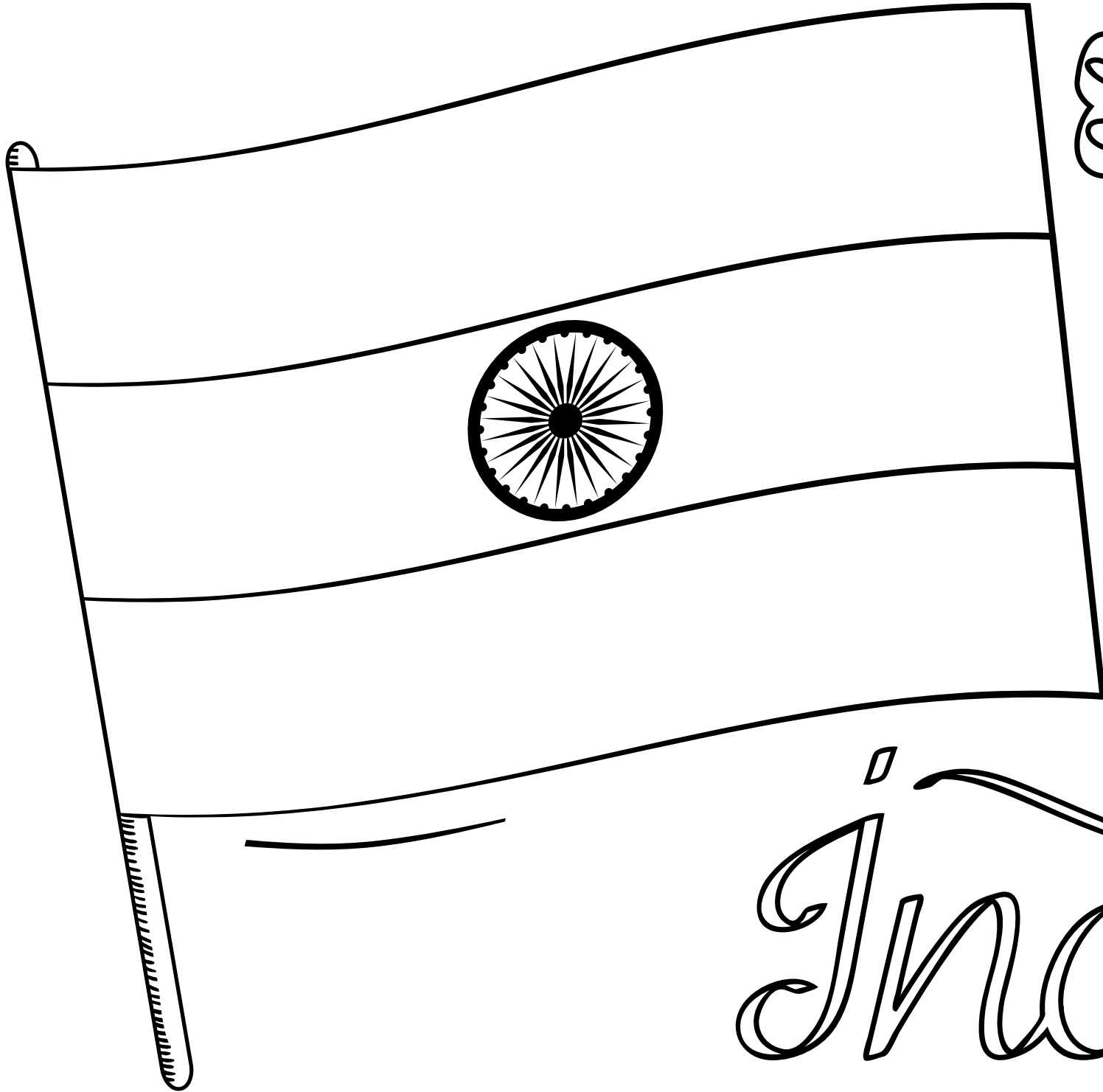

CASTE SYSTEM

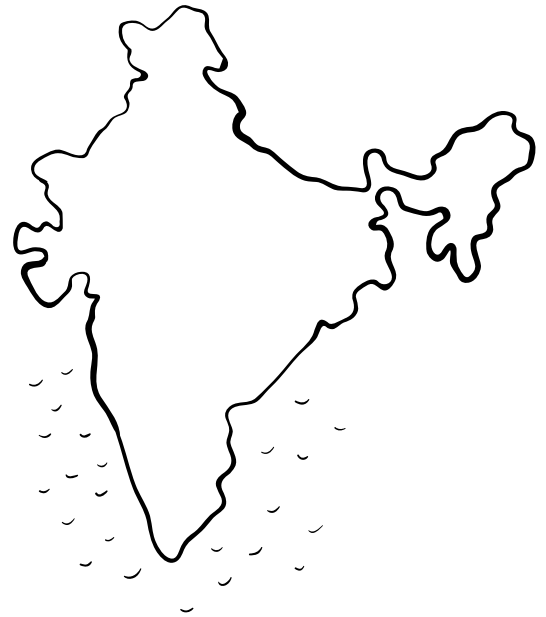
Society in India is divided into social ranks, called castes, which you are born into and can never change. High castes include priests, landowners, and soldiers.

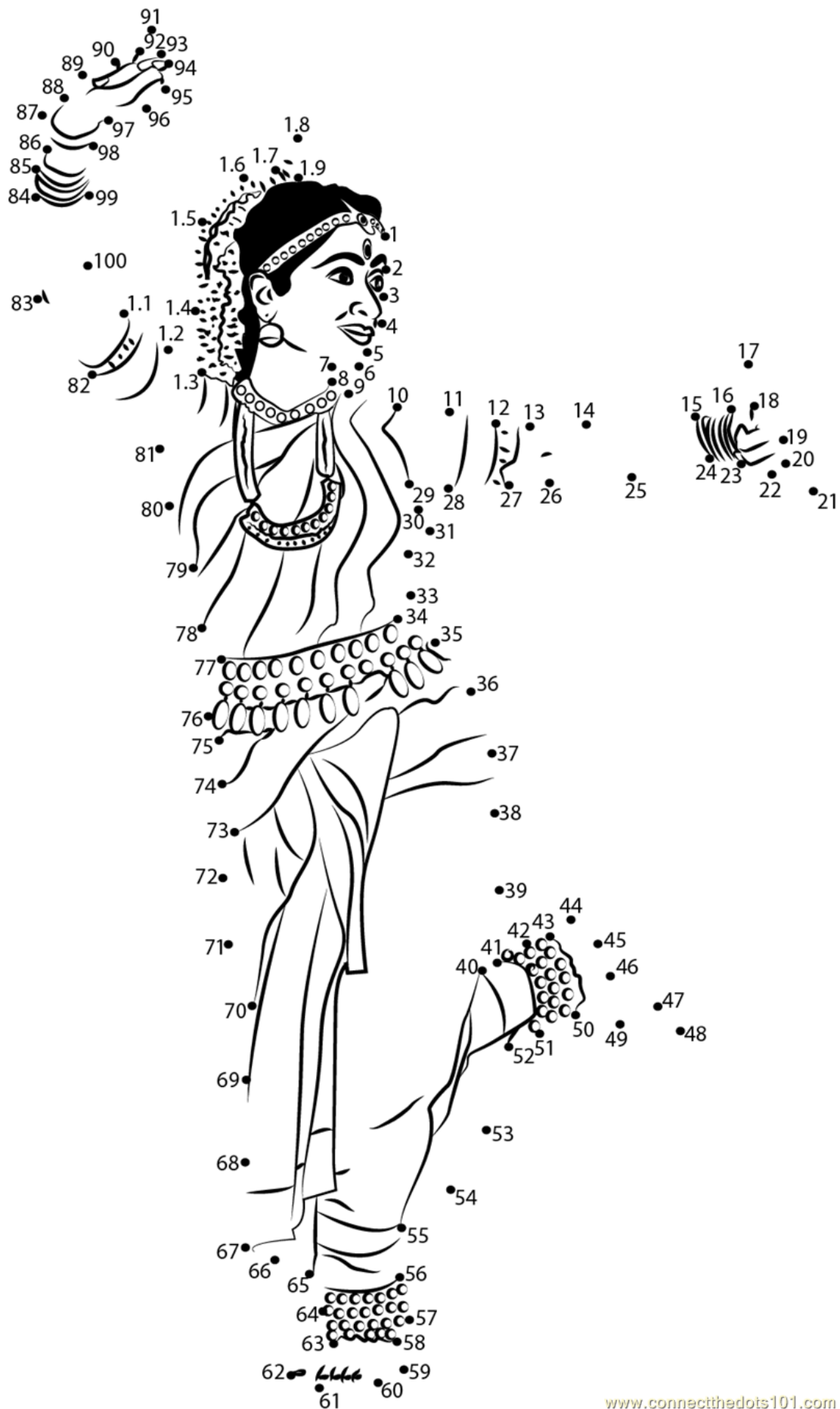

Raita Recipe

- ½ cup of plain yoghurt
- ½ cup of chopped cucumber
- 2 tablespoons of fresh cilantro/coriander
- 2 teaspoons of chopped green onions
- ¼ teaspoon of ground coriander
- ¼ teaspoon of cumin

Preparation

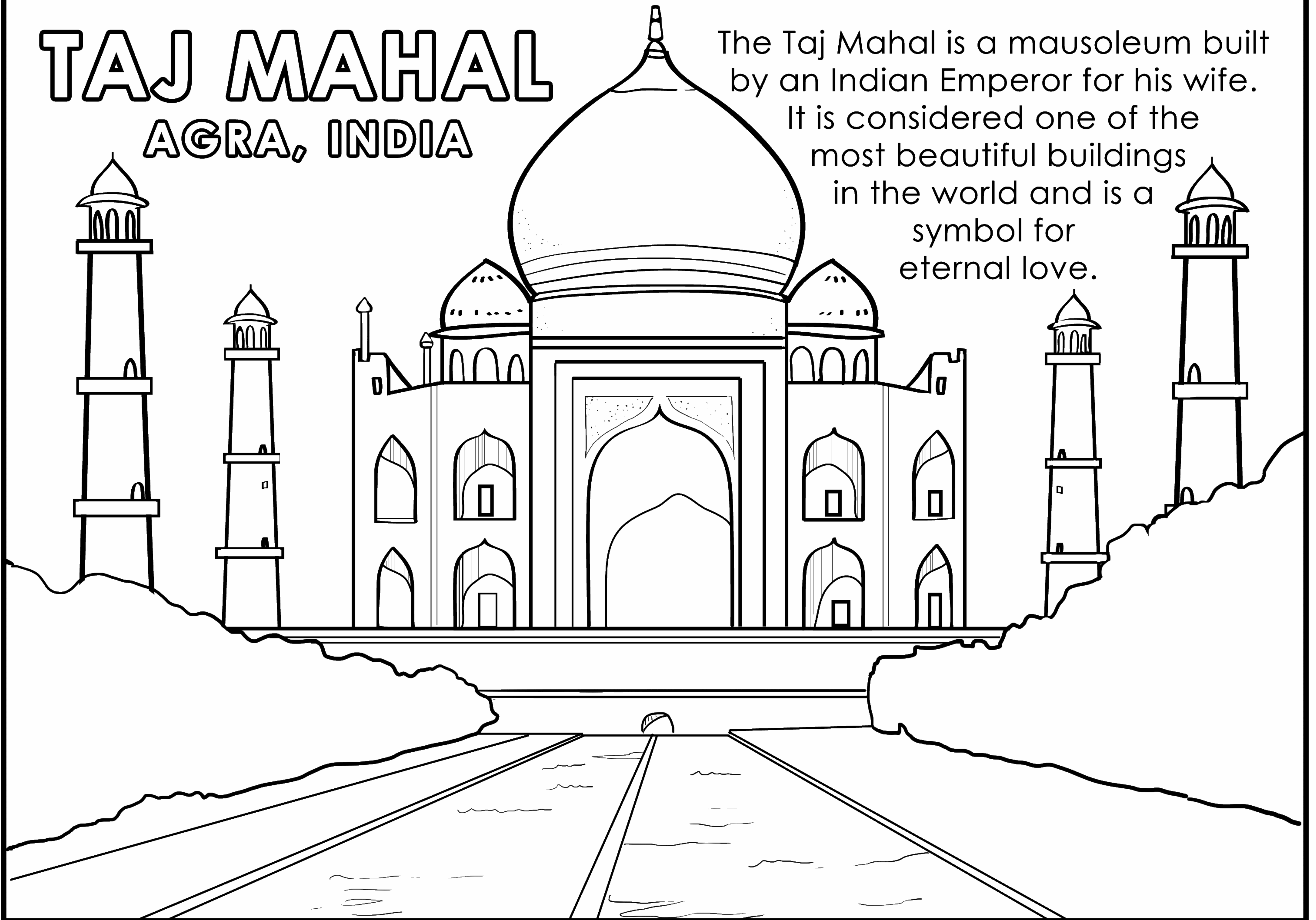
This is an extremely simple process. Put everything into a mixing bowl, mix together and salt to taste, and chill, until you are ready to serve. Goes very well with poppadum'!



TAJ MAHAL

AGRA, INDIA

The Taj Mahal is a mausoleum built by an Indian Emperor for his wife. It is considered one of the most beautiful buildings in the world and is a symbol for eternal love.



Taj Mahal



The Taj Mahal, also known as the 'Crown of the Palace', is an ivory white marble mausoleum on the southern bank of the River Yamuna in the Indian City of Agra. It was commissioned in 1632 by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan to house the tomb of his favourite wife Mumtaz Mahal. It also houses the tomb of Emperor Shah himself, and it is the centrepiece of a 17-hectare complex, which includes a mosque, a guest house, and is set in formal gardens, bounded by a crenelated wall.

Tea Plantation



Commercial tea plantations were first established under the British Rule when a native variety of *Camellia sinensis* plant was discovered by Scotsman Robert Bruce in 1823 in Assam. The story goes that a local merchant, Maniram Dewan, introduced Bruce to the Singpho people who were drinking something very similar to tea.

Gateway of India – Mumbai



The Gateway of India is an arch monument built in the early twentieth century in the city of Mumbai, in the Indian state of Maharashtra. It was built to commemorate the landing in December 1911 at Apollo Bunder, Mumbai of King Emperor George V and Queen-Empress Mary, the first British monarch to visit India.

Pathirakali Temple



Pathirakali Amman Temple is a Hindu temple dedicated to the goddess Bhadrakali, a form of the goddess Kali Amman in Trincomalee, Eastern Province, Sri Lanka. The Kali temple of the ancient *Trincomalee Koneswaram Temple Compounds*, a large complex of connected shrines in the Trincomalee Konesar Malai area. Made in classical Dravidian architecture, the *Kovil* is located just beyond the Konesar Road Esplanade before the entrance to Konamamalai (Swami Rock). Proximal to the ancient Koneswaram temple, both ancient temples share functions during Ther Thiruvillah Festival procession and the Back Bay Sea (Theertham Karatkarai). Pathirakali Amman temple has attracted pilgrims from before the 11th century CE.

Meenākshi Ammán Temple



Meenakshi Temple, is a historic Hindu temple located on the southern bank of the Vaigai River in the temple city of Madurai, Tamil Nadu, India. It is dedicated to Meenakshi, a form of Parvati, and her consort, *Sundareshwar*, a form of Shiva. The temple is at the centre of the ancient temple city of Madurai mentioned in the Tamil Sangam literature, with the goddess temple mentioned in 6th century CE texts.
