WELCOME TO BORNEO



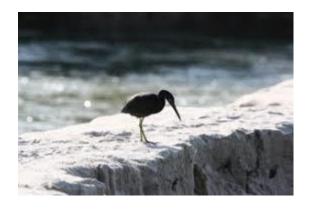
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Borneo:

1. Is an Island in Asia, that is situated in the South East part of Asia's Malay Archipelago. It is known well for their beaches, and beautiful rainforest, and extensive wildlife.



2. Population: There is 21,258,000 that live in Borneo.





3. History: Borneo is known as Kalimantan, but this is only for Indonesian part of Borneo.



4. There was a confrontation that took place in

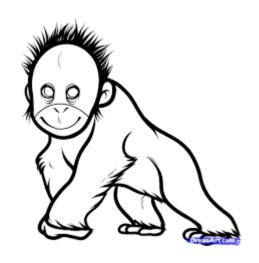
Brunei in 1962-66. The Royal Marines from HMS Bulwark and British armed forces maintained the border between Malaysia and Indonesia. Until the Indonesian Government decided to stop the fighting.





Many claim that the Island is always known as Borneo Island, which consist of Sabah, Sarawak, Kalimantan and Brunei areas.

- 5. Borneo is the world's third largest island, behind Greenland and New Guinea.
- 6. Beautiful rainforest of Borneo and Sumatra are homes for Orangutans and the largest flower in the world, "The Rafflesia Arnoldii flower". This flower is also known as "The corpse flower", as it is said to smell like rotting corpses. (not a pleasant thought).





How did Borneo become the world's largest timber exporter?

Before the massive deforestation Borneo rainforest was almost impenetrable due to the great variety and quantity of trees and other plants that made it up.

During hostile deforestation, the forests lost two thirds of their extension, while the island became the largest exporter of timber in the world, even above the Amazon and Africa together. In this way the beautiful and varied trunks of Borneo, crowned by beautiful green branches, in a short time came to China, Japan, the United States and Europe, its main buyers, where they became wooden houses, parquet floors, gates, staircases, furniture, paper, hooks for clothes and other artifacts.

According to the newspaper El País, of Spain: "monster local boats enter to interior of island loaded with heavy last generation machinery, to return full of wood and coal".

Initially, most of the wood was extracted from Malaysia, in the northern states of Sabah and Sarawak. Then, the forests of southern Indonesia became the main source of tropical timber. The industrial wood trade took off in the 1970s. According to Mongabay,

"The president of Indonesia Suharto distributed large tracts of forest to consolidate his political relations with army generals. Deforestation increased significantly in the 1980s, with the creation of roads for the access of settlers and developers to remote areas. At the same time, the government transmigration program in Indonesia had its heyday and sent more than 18,000 people a year for a decade to settle in Kalimantan.

These migrants, mostly poor young people who lacked land in the crowded central islands of Java and Bali, were placed by the government on land that was often inadequate for traditional agriculture. Since they cannot keep up with agriculture, many of these people joined the logging companies to work."

The Borneo mountain rainforests lie in the central highlands of the island, above the 1,000 metres (3,300 ft) elevation. These areas represent habitat for many endangered species; for example, orangutans, elephants, and rare endemics such as the elusive Hose's civet.



OTHER INTERESTING FACTS:

- 7. Borneo is not a country, but an Island, that is made up of 13 different countries-Brunei, Malaysia, and Indonesia.
- 8. Half of the world's timber comes from Borneo. Over forty years ago 73% of the country was covered by rainforest, tragically today only 50.5% is left.
- 9. Borneo is the worlds third largest island, behind Greenland and New Guinea. Orangutans can only be found in the rainforest of Borneo and Sumatra.
- 10. The Rainforest in Borneo is the oldest in the world and is said to be 130 million years old.

CULTURE:

- 11. There are over 200 different ethnic groups in Borneo.
- 12. The people that make up those groups are known as Dayaks. (See below, in traditional clothes)
- 13. The Iban people have a history of headhunting, it is mentioned that you can travel with a guide on a four-hour drive to stay overnight in their "Longhouse". It is situated along the Lemanak River in Sarawak.
- 14. If this is not your style you can say a Gaya Island with is on the edge of the Tunku Abdul Rahman Marine Park.



13. Borneo is the home of the smallest elephant in Asia, known as the Pygmy elephant. Characteristics described as having a "Baby Face".



- 14. Life span of the Elephant is 55-70 years, and have larger ears, longer tails and straighter tusks, than other elephants.
- 15. The Elephant is very social animals that live in order or (matriarchal hierarchy). They live in family units, mothers, daughters, sisters and immature males. The adult male tends to live mostly alone.
- 16. The Pygmy elephant eat grasses, fruits, palms and banana plants, and also have a diet of minerals, obtained by salt.
- 17. They have a highly developed brain, which is 3-4 times bigger than a human brain.
- 18. They have poor vision, but keen sense of smell.

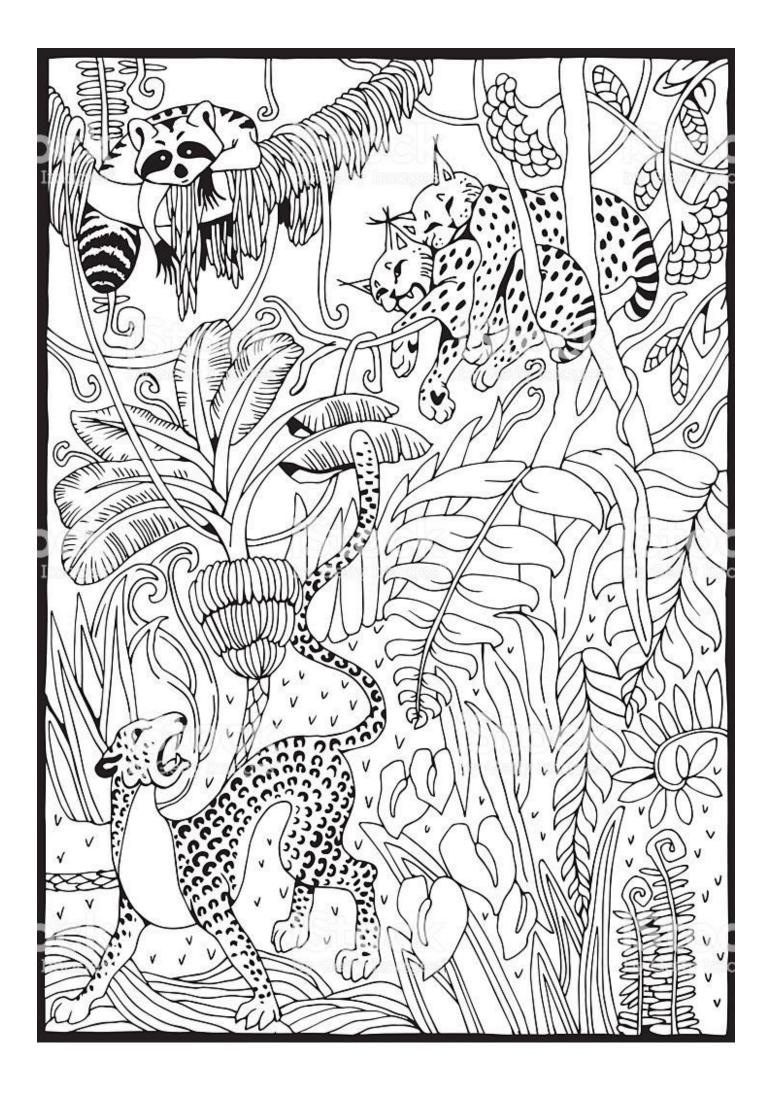

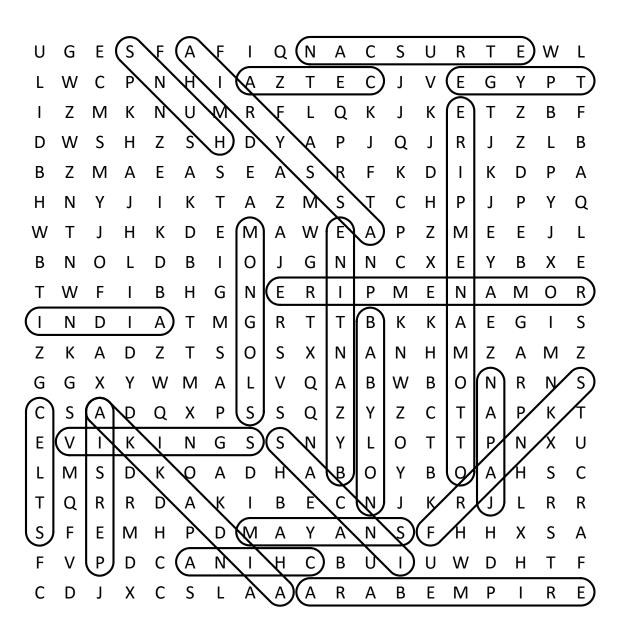

Orangutan Facts

Orangutans live in **INDONESIA** and Malaysia on the islands of **BORNEO** and Sumatra. Orangutans are **ENDANGERED** and these are the only places where wild orangutans live in the rainforest, which is being cut down for wood to make paper and furniture and the land cleared to grow **PALM OIL** for using as fuel and as an ingredient in lots of foods. It is thought that Sumatran **ORANGUTANS** may become **EXTINCT** in the next 50 years unless people help to protect them.

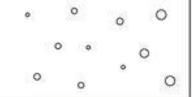
Orangutans are a Great **APE** along with gorillas, chimpanzees and bonobos. Apes don't have **TAILS** whereas most monkeys do. They mostly eat **FRUITS** – and their favourites are huge spiky fruits called *Durian*, which actually westerners think smell very bad. Orangutans sleep in **NESTS** in the trees which they make every day from leaves and branches.

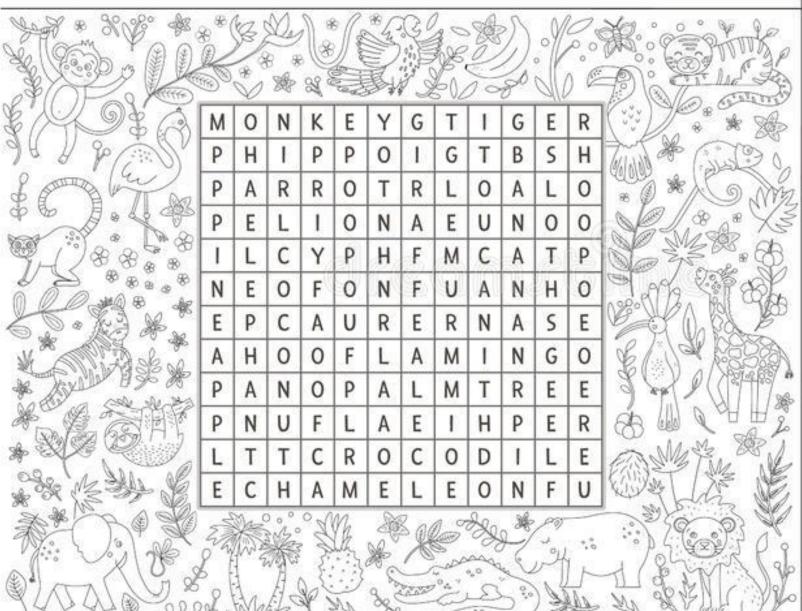
SOS visits schools and villages in **SUMATRA** to talk to people about orangutans and their **HABITAT** and we to give tree **SEEDLINGS** to schools so that children can replant the **FORESTS** around their villages. We are also replanting trees inside the **GUNUNG** Leuser National Park to restore the forest for orangutans.
