activity here at Caladenia and as I have written in my Annual Report - Caladenia has made a "Quantum Leap" in service provision.

Service hours

increased from 477 person hours per week average in 2016/17 to 570 person hours per week in the six months ending 30 June 2018, and the Board thanks the Caladenia Staff who have worked so hard to get the new programs up and running.

In April 2017 one of our many wonderful volunteers, Allan Mason, passed away. In his Will he left a bequest to Caladenia. As I write this report, we are waiting on a distribution from his Estate of a seven figure sum. This is by far the largest "donation" that has been made to Caladenia in its history.
